GMP FOR SUPPLEMENTS

International Alliance of Dietary/ Food Supplement Associations

Unusual to find food supplement law that does not include GMP standards for supplements



Impact

Companies trading internationally facing multiple obstacles to enter markets

SMEs may struggle to comply.



Reasons

Lack of recognition of other GMPs

Lack of recognition of of third party
GMP inspections where there is no government
certification in place and/or

Lack of resources in country to conduct inspections overseas.



Lack of recognition of overseas practices/ lack of resources for overseas inspections / Lack of national Standards

TOLERANCES

A priority in several countries/ regions



Harmonisation difficult



lack of understanding of the factors affecting the accuracy of the determination of the nutritional content of supplement products.

- Gather challenges/ questions addressed by Industry / governments around the globe on tolerances – under /overages
- 2. Map out regional/national requirements
- 3. Develop a short paper for decision makers addressing the issues and elements to take into account when setting overage provisions
- Develop a technical report for technical experts addressing in detail the issues
- 5. Develop a procedure to set proper tolerance including "Do & Don't" lists.

More reticence from Governments to allow botanicals in supplements without more data


DIRECTIONS FOR CONSIDERATION Botanicals

- Adulteration: Development of a scoping paper on adulteration.
- 2. Positive lists: Mapping of government methodology for the establishment of positive lists
- 3. Challenges around combination products: Development of an executive summary
- 4. Adverse Events: Introductory paper on the US model. This could be extended to other systems.
- 5. Orientation paper on the safety of botanical extracts addressing, for example, tradition.
